Introduction

The Indian Navy is the naval branch of the Indian Armed Forces. The President of India is the Supreme Commander of the Indian Navy. The Chief of Naval Staff, a four-star admiral, commands the navy.

The full range of operations in which a nation's naval forces may be involved is vast, ranging from high intensity war fighting at one end to humanitarian assistance and disaster relief operations at the other end. This broad continuum of operations can be broken down into distinct roles, each demanding a specific approach to the conduct of operations.

 - There is penalty for wrong answers.

 - **2 Paper**= General Ability
 - General Ability Test paper is divided into two parts –
Part A and Part B.
Part A has 50 English questions
Part B has 100 General Knowledge questions.

Eligibility:

Education: Candidates should have Passed Senior Secondary Examination (10+2 Pattern) or its equivalent examinations from any Board with at least 70% aggregate marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics (PCM)

Selection Process for Indian Navy Technical Entry Scheme (TES)
